Maths

★ Place Value

Hundreds, thousands, ordering numbers, roman numerals, rounding, negative numbers

★ Addition and Subtraction

Addition and subtraction of 4-digit, 3-digit, 2-digit and 1-digit numbers (crossing and not crossing the 10s and 100s and with one or more exchanges), add and subtract multiples of 100,

Class 3 Curriculum Autumn 2023

English

★ Diary Writing

The children will be reading Street Child and doing lots of activities associated with the book. They will write their own diary entries as a character in the story.

★ Letter Writing.

The children will look at lots of letters and will analyse the different features included. They will then write their own letter of persuasion relating to street child.

★ Research- Information Text about a Victorian school. In their writing, children will be using; expanded noun phrases, a wide range of conjunctions, fronted adverbials, imagery, show don't tell and speech punctuation.

<u>Science</u>

Electricity

★ Children will learn about what electricity is and how it was discovered. They will identify which appliances use electricity in their homes and how to keep themselves safe. Children will construct circuits, start to create pictorial circuits and conduct an investigation into how easily different types of switches can break and reconnect a circuit.



The Victorians

Children will explore life before and after the school act. Children will use their historical skills to look at various different sources and will decide if before or after would be a better time to be educated. We will look into the cause and effect of the industrial revolution. Children will also learn about the inventions of the time. In art, children will complete block printing paintings in the style of William Morris.



Computing

Online Safety

★ Children are introduced to email and other forms of online communication. They will look at how to write and send emails, as well as how to decide if an email is safe to open. The use and importance of privacy settings is introduced, and children will discuss the types of information we should not share online. They will build on the idea of a digital footprint by thinking about how the adverts they see online are targeted at them.

RE

★ Rules for Living.

This unit is all about rules in which Christians follow such as the ten commandments and the ways in which children follow rules in life.

PΕ

Children will attend swimming every Tuesday. On Wednesday, coach Paul Stabler, will deliver tag rugby.

PSHCE

TEAM

★ This unit is inspired by the idea that if a class team works well together, it has a positive impact on all of its members and what they can achieve. It aims to enable the children to identify the impact their actions have on the team they are working in. Children learn about successful teamwork skills, being considerate of others in the team and how to positively resolve any conflicts that occur.

Maths

* Multiplication and Division

Multiply and divide by 3, 4, 6, 7, 9, 10, 100 and the multiplication and division facts.

Multiplication as equal groups, multiply and divide by 0, 1, 10, 100, comparing statements, related calculations, multiplying 3 numbers, efficient multiplication and factor pairs.

English

- ★ Film review on the first ever film made in the Victorian days.
- ★ Film review on a Disney Pixar film.
- ★ A comparison of the films.
- ★ Poetry

In their writing, children will be using; expanded noun phrases, a wide range of conjunctions, fronted adverbials, imagery, show don't tell and speech punctuation.

Science

Living Things and Their Habitats

★Children will explore a variety of ways to identify, sort, group and classify living things. They will learn how animals are split into vertebrates and invertebrates. They will look at different habitats and the idea that environments are subject to man-made and natural changes-they will understand how the changes can have significant impact on living things.



Entertainment Through the 20th century

Children will research and use sources given to gather information about entertainment through the 20th century, to modern day entertainment. Children will be looking at primary and secondary sources and will learn the differences in reliability between the sources. Children will create travel brochures, profiles and chronological timelines and booklets. By the end of the topic, they will be aware of how entertainment has translated into life today. Children will use their design technology teaching to create their own cinema box.



Computing

Word Processing

★ Children will learn about formatting images and organising content into and effective layout. They will focus on formatting images and making them suitable for a poster advertising a movie. The children will learn new skills and techniques and apply them to creating a range of different word documents (posters, letters, tables and evouchers) which they will use during the movie project.

RE

★Christmas Around the World.

Children will look at Christmas in different countries and compare the traditions that take place compared to the children's own traditions.

PΕ

PE coach, Mr Stabler, will deliver sports hall athletics. This will include field and track events encouraging pupils to achieve their personal best. Children will attend swimming on a Tuesday.

PSHCE

Britain

★ This unit is inspired by the idea that we live in a diverse, multicultural and democratic society and that this is important and brings many benefits. It aims to enable the children to identify that they should be respectful of difference. In this unit, children learn about British people, rules, the law, liberty and what living in a democracy means. They also learn about the importance of being tolerant of differences within their society.
