Homework

Homework

Homework will be sent out at the beginning of the half term and will include two tasks. The first a research activity and the second a creative task, both based on the topic. Details of when this should be handed in are on the homework sheets and on Seesaw.

Reading

Reading at home is extremely important! We would love to see your child's 'Home Reading Diaries' at least three times a week, signed by the person who has listened to them read. Your child will take a book home from school that is appropriate for them and also have access to the Bug Club where books and games will be added weekly. I would be grateful if you could ensure your child's reading diary is always in school on a **Friday**.

Spellings/Phonics

Work is done every day at school on the children's spellings. We will send a new set of spellings every week for your child to learn based on what they have been doing in school. If you could practise these with your children, we would greatly appreciate it. The children will be tested on these spellings every Friday. Please ensure their spelling book is in school on a **Friday**.

Maths

Year 1 — Counting forwards and backwards to 100 from any number, practise number bonds to 10 and 20, counting in ones, twos fives and tens.

Year 2-2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables and the division facts. Your child will also have access to Times Table Rock Stars when it is appropriate for them.

★ Children will build on important computer skills needed for safe and effective computer use and introduce some further skills concerning the use of folders, searching for files and printing. They will be introduced to presentations and the skills needed to create a simple presentation about a monarch using Microsoft PowerPoint.

Children will have 2 PE lessons per week. They will learn and participate in the different events in the sport, Athletics and will learn the skills involved in cricket. Mrs Stabler and Mrs Macaulay will deliver the PE lessons.

Children will also learn about the importance of exercise and living a healthy lifestyle.

Class 2 Curriculum Summer Year B

English

★ Fairytales

Children will be finding out what makes a magical fairytale. They will read several different stories but be focusing on Snow White and the Seven Dwarves.

After finding out about the characters, plot and setting, the children will twist the fairytale and rewrite it from the Evil Queens point of view... Did she really want Snow White dead?

★ Kings and Queens

Children will research and focus on a British monarch and write a detailed fact file about them.

Children will write a letter to the King.

History-Kings and Queens

This term, we will be looking at significant British Kings and Queens. The children will find out what a King or Queen must do and discuss the qualities they should have. We will be looking at family trees and timelines of British monarchs and will also be comparing them. Children will compare the significance of Queen Elizabeth II and Queen Victoria and how they influenced change. We will also look at Sarah Forbes Bonetta, who she was and why she is remembered. Our art focus will look at creating self-portraits, moving on to looking at the work of Andy Warhol for inspiration for our own portrait of a King or Queen of their choice.

Children will discuss the idea of spending and saving their money and begin to understand why it is important to keep belongings, including money, safe. They will also learn about the different things on offer when they go shopping and how we need to identify the difference between what we want and what we need

Children will write about the Greatham Feast.

Geography- Festivals around the world.

Children will find out about festivals from all over the world. They will locate them on a map and describe their positions in relation to the equator, poles and UK. Using this information, we will suggest why these festivals take place in these countries and compare them. They will also plan a trip to one of these counties, thinking about what they would need and how they would travel there.

We will also be looking at and evaluating Royal Doulton and then designing and making our very own clay cup in Art.



Science

Light and Shadows

Children will observe the apparent movement of the sun during the day, observe light coming from a light source, observe light being blocked by an object to create a shadow, investigate how to make a place lighter and darker and know light and dark safety.

<u>Aiming High</u>

★ Children will leam about having high aspirations. They will discuss positive views of themselves and will then identify how having a positive leaming attitude can help them tackle and achieve new leaming challenges and improve. In doing this, some of the difficulties faced by stereotyping will be explored. Children will also have the opportunity to discuss what they are looking forward to about their leaming next year.
