Homework

Homework

Homework will be sent out at the beginning of the half term and will include two tasks. The first is a research activity and the second a creative task, both based on this term's topic. Homework is due back on the last Tuesday of the half term.

Spellings/Phonics

Work is done every day at school on the children's spellings. We will send a new set of spellings every week for your child to learn. If you could practise these with your children, we would greatly appreciate it. Spellings will be given out on a Friday and children will be tested the following Friday.

Maths

Year 1 – Counting forwards and backwards to 100 from any number, practise number bonds to 10 and 20, counting in ones, twos fives and tens.

Year 2-2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables and the division facts. Your child will also have access to Times Table Rock Stars when it is appropriate for them.

Children will develop their instructional writing, making instructions for how to make a dragon and how to catch a dragon!

★ Story Writing

After reading a variety of stories, the children will plan and write their own adventure story!

The writing focuses will ensure children use capital letters to start sentences, full stops to end and finger spaces between words. Children will also be using question marks, exclamation marks and commas to punctuate their work.

Science

Animals Including Humans

★ The children will identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They will identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. They will name, identify and label the parts of the human body and learn about the 5 senses.



China

In this topic the children will explore the country of China. We will create our own maps of China adding physical and human features. They will use aerial photographs to compare China's development over time and identify different features of the country. They will explore how the climate, population and other features differ across the country and the reasons for this. The children will also design, make and evaluate their own moving Chinese dragon.

Children will create a diary entry as though they witnessed 'The Great Fire of London'

★ Non-Fiction

The children will be using non-fiction books to research The Great Fire of London. They will look at the features of non-fiction books, e.g. contents, index, glossary. The children will use what they have found to create a class information book.

Science

Everyday Materials

★ The Children will distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made, identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock. Also, they will investigate the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials and compare and group them together on the basis of these physical properties.



The Great Fire of London

The children will research this period in British history and compare how people lived then to how we live now. The children will begin the topic by discussing their knowledge of London. The children will place the Great Fire on a class time line and sequence the main events of the fire correctly. They will discover why the fire started and how it ended. The children will discover that the fire was represented in different ways and explore different sources of evidence, deciding what these show us and how reliable they are. They will look at the causes of the fire and what the consequences of these were as well as discovering how the fire changed the country. The children will create a painting/picture of London using colour mixing and colour wash techniques.
