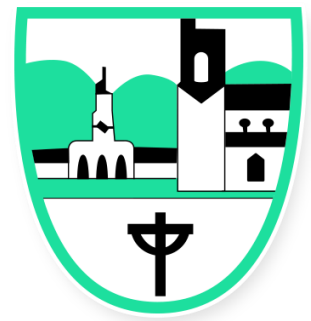


Class 4 News
